



FirstSteps Youth Workshop *Looking to Take Next Step*

Franklin D. Roosevelt once said, “You cannot always build the future for our youth; but we can build our youth for the future.” This is the goal for the PFM youth seminar, “*FirstSteps: Discovering the*

Pathway to Purpose in Your Life.” The approximately sixty-minute presentation, which debuted in July 2006 to a small group of incoming freshmen of North High School in Des Moines, IA, challenges youth to reflect critically on their interests and natural giftedness, discover their own purpose, and learn the various potholes that lie in the road to their success. PFM has bigger ideas, however. We plan to expand the workshop into a full school day (approximately six hours), enlist other youth to serve as aids, and solicit local businesses and civic groups to sponsor food, materials, and workshop memorabilia. 
